Dress Code

Pathfinders reserves the right to maintain the standards outlined in our dress code.

- Pathfinders should be modest, clean and neat, avoiding extremes in clothing and hairstyles.
- Fashion extremes such as ripped or torn, frayed, unhemmed, sheer, short, and tight-fitting clothing, etc. are not appropriate.
- Shirts with pictures/slogans inappropriate to a Christian are not to be worn.
- Shirts should fully cover undergarments and midriff and not be low cut at the neck line.
- No spaghetti straps. Tank tops must have a minimum of 3 finger widths at shoulder and no low/gaping arm holes.
- Modest hemmed shorts may be worn by the Pathfinder. Shorts should be at least mid-thigh (half-way between the hip joint and knee joint) in length and when sitting cross-legged are not revealing.

Pathfinder Conduct Commitment for 2020-2021

Parental Cooperation – I will cooperate:

1. By learning how I can assist the applicant and his/her leaders.
2. By encouraging the applicant to take an active part in all activities.
3. By attending events to which parents/guardians are invited.
4. By assisting club leaders and by serving as leaders if called upon.

Weekly Meetings

1. The “B” uniform (club T-shirt) is expected to be worn as the top layer of clothing at every meeting. If the Pathfinder is cold, a long-sleeve shirt may be worn underneath it.
2. The Pathfinder Record Journal will be brought to every meeting.
3. A cheerful, co-operative attitude is expected.
4. Candy, gum, roller blades, skate boards, scooters, cell phones, personal entertainment devices and headphones will be left at home. If brought to Pathfinder meetings, they will be confiscated for the duration of the meeting.
5. I will respect God:
 - I will not use God’s name in vain.
 - I will not use any foul language.
6. I will respect school/church property:
 - I will not take things home that belong to the school/church.
 - I will not write on walls or damage school/church property.
7. I will respect Counsellors and Volunteers:
 - I will speak nicely to my Counsellor and Volunteers.
 - I will not touch things that belong to the adults.
8. I will respect other Pathfinders and their possessions:
 - I will speak to other Pathfinders in a nice voice.
 - I will not call other Pathfinders bad names or make fun of them.
 - I will not bully or exclude other Pathfinders.
 - I will include other Pathfinders in the activities.
 - I will keep my hands to myself. I will not hit others or try to hurt them or pester them.
 - I will leave other Pathfinders possessions alone. If I find something that is lost, I will return it.
9. Misconduct at club events will bring the following action:
 - 1st warning – verbal warning to Pathfinder by Director or Counsellor.
 - 2nd warning – verbal warning to Pathfinder and written notice to parents.
 - 3rd warning – 1 week’s suspension.
 - 4th warning – dismissal from club for remainder of year.
 - Inappropriate sexual behaviour may result in immediate dismissal.

Campouts

1. All Pathfinders are expected to cheerfully participate in unit-assigned chores and group activities during campouts.
2. The purpose of camping is to enjoy God’s creation while providing an opportunity to learn new skills. The following devices are not conducive to this aim and we expect that they will be left at home: firecrackers, slingshots, knives (unless specifically asked to bring them), entertainment devices, cell phones, magazines and books not of a spiritual nature.
